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Cula

By Royal Decree of December 19, 1854, stamps were to be used for the payment of postage beginning March 1, 1855. The stamps were engraved by Don Jose Perez Varela. Electrotypes were made from the die and assembled into plates of 170 plates arranged in 17 colums of 10 rows. The stamp size is 18.5mm by 22.5mm and bears a portrait of Queen Isabella II facing right.


Typographed on Yellowish white-blue hand made paper watermarked "loops".

Watermarks were prescribed by a Royal Order dated October 16, 1854. There are three main types of the loop watermark and 1 sub varieties. IN the most common, the end of each loop is directly above or below the space between the opposing loops. In 10 per cent of the stamps, the loops are directly opposite. this occurs in eather row 3 (see next page) or row 5 (see "Estudio Sobre La Primers Emision Postal De Antillas Espanolas", by J. L. Guerra Aquira, Havana, Cuba, 1976, page 26, in Book V, Section 5.)

A sub variety of the two occurs in row 9, (see next page) that I call "Opposed offset". In this variety the center of the loop on one row is lined up on the right or left edge of the loop above it. So far this variety has been reported in row 9 only.

A rarely found third type occurs due to an error in the placement of the sheet of paper on an angle in the printing press, causing a complete loop to appear on the stamp. As can be seen by the strip of 3 stamps, the watermark moves up the as you go from left to right (very rare). As the watermark moves up until it becomes centered it's rarety increases.

Surcharges of 1855. First & Second Issue. November 19, 1855.

On April 19, 1985, Don Narciso de la Torre y Marin, General Administrator of Posts for the Island, recomended to Captain General Don Jose de la Concha, the creation of a system of home delivery with in Cuba, mainly in Havana. To effect Y 1/4". This was to stand for Interior but the "Y" was a replacement of the "I" so that it could not be mistaken for 1 1/4. On November 15, 1855 in Gaceta Official it was announced that local delivery for Havana only would start on November 19, 1855.

The Surcharge was applied in the print shop of J. Toribio de Arazoza in Havana. It was applied in black ink using standard moveable type. The printing was done two rows at a time on sheets of 170 stamps. Because of the short time the printer had, he was forced to use what ever type was on hand and this caused him to use two different types of Y.





Surcharges of 1855 Forgeries. First & Second Issue. November 19, 1855.

The Y1/4 surcharge of 1855 on the 2 Reals watermarked "loops" has been extensively forged, but all of the forgeries are philatelic. These can be quite dangerous as the forgeries were applied to real stamps. They is a great deal of confusion as to what the real surcharge looks like i.e the illustrations of these in the Scott catalog are of Fournier forgeries.



Third Issue, September 1856.

Spanish stamps with the watermark loops were being counterfeited is Spain, so a so a new issue was placed in circulation in Spain on January 1, 1856. This issue is on rough hand made paper of a yellowish shade, watermarked with cross lines. The patterns of the crossed lines formes a lattice of perfect squares 7mm on a side. The issue date of the stamp use in Cuba, is estimated to be September 1856.

Fourth Issue Surcharged for Local Delivery.

On the Dull Rose 2 Reals of the Forth Issue, 200,000 "Y1/4" surcharges were applied by the print shop of J. Toribio in Havana, Cuba. in early 1858. The type used in this issue was different from from that used in earlier issues. The fraction bar is a 1 lying on its left side and all of the "Y" are similar.

Forgeries of the first four issues.

The forgeries of Spanish Stamps used in Cuba range from the crude to the expert, and considering the lack of quality control at the Stamp Printing Office in Madrid, were often accepted by the postal clerks. Since some of the forgeries were as good, if not better than the genuine it is important to list as many Postal and Philatelic fakes as possible.

Issue of November, 1862

Designed by Don Jose Perez Varela, the new stamp of 1/4 Real, for local delivery was placed on sale in Cuba. Yhe stamps were typographed from plates composed of 200 cliches divided into two panes of 100, each 10 by 10. The paper is a thinnish, tinted, wove type, unwatermarked. This issue is imperforate. The only flaws found so far are in the lower corner orniments that are composed of an X with o in between the spokes. The number of pearls on genuine stamps ane 34 across top and 43 on each side.



Issue of January 1, 1864.

In January, 1864 a new definitive issue was placed on sale differing from the issue for Spain of January 1, 1864, only in the currency used. This issue became necessary owing to the extensive falsification of the of the 1855 design issues and the deterioration of the plates used in the many printings. The dies were engraved by Don Jose Perez Varela. This issue was typographed on unwatermarked, moderately thick, wove paper. Printed at the Fabrica Nacional de Sellos, Madrid. The issue includes a 1/4 Real value to provide for the local delivery fee.





Issue of January 1, 1866.

On January 1, 1866 a new issue reflecting the change to a deciaml currency of 100 centimos de Escudo equals 1 Escudo was placed in use. The design is the same as that of the 1864 issue except in the currency block. For the first time the year of issue also appears on the stamps in the currency block This issue was not used in Puerto Rico, as the currency change did not take place there until 1868. Printed on unwatermarked, very thin, yellowish white, wove paper, and is imperforated.

Surcharge of November 1866.

The 5c. balue of the issue of 1866 was used to pay the fee for local delivery. These quickly came to be unavailable due to use. So as an expedient remainders of the 1/4 Real of the 1864 issue were surcharged to validate them for use in 1866, this being necessary because of the change to a decimal currency. Initially, a small "1866" was applied by handstamp: but after about 5% of the projected amount to be surcharged had been handstamped, it was determined that the handstamp was too small to be easily seen. The entire lot, including those already handstamped, was sent to a printer where a large "66" was typographed on the stamps.





## Surcharges of 1868

A revolution in Sapin on September 29, 1868, overthrew Isabella II. The revolution was led by Marshall Serrano, and led to the Constitution of 1869. By an order dated September 30, 1868, all postage and tax order were composed of fat Roman type face prepared by the Fabrica Nacional de Moneda y Timbre in Madrid. Because the handstamp was applied to one stamp at a time they may appear in any position with the most prominate being an oblique angle rising from left to right.

The Republic in Spain, founded by Marshall Serrano lasted until November 3, 1870, when the monarchy was restored. Amadeo second son of the King of Savoy, Victor Emmanuel II, arrived in Spain on December 27, 1870 and became Amadeo I of Spain. His reign lasted until February, 1873. This issue depicts the portrait of Amadeo, and was engraved by Eugenio Julia y Jover, typographed at the Fabrica Nacional de Moneda y Timbre in Madrid, on very thin, white, wove paper. It is unwatermarked and perforated 14.

Issue of Revolution Government in Exile 1874.

The Revolutionary Government of Cuba operating in the field against the forces of Spain authorized the revolutionary Junta in the United States to have the stamp printed to serve two purposes; one, to pay postage on correspondence in territory controlled by them (Cuba Libre) and, two, to be sold as a means of propaganda and to collect funds to buy arms and supplies. The legal basis was the Law of of August 9, 1869, of the Republic and a Decree of January 25, 1871. The Stamp was used through out the Island but mostly around Holguin in the Eastern end of the Island. Steel engraved by the American Bank Note Company, it was printed by them in sheets of 100 (10 x 10) on unwatermarked paper and perforated 12. 100,000 stamps were printed.




