

#### THE OVERPRINTED STAMPS 1855 - 1960



Because of a theft of stamps in 1883, the series in use at the time were surcharged to make them different until a new set of stamps arrived from Spain.













1883 folded letter from Havana to Teruel, Spain. Very few of the overprinted stamps of this series have survived the passage of time, they are quite rare on cover.


